

A RESOLUTION ON
NO-WINTER-POWER-SHUT-OFF DAY

WHEREAS, a recent Illinois Commerce Commission decision will allow power service to be terminated to a residential customer in the winter as long as the temperature stays above 20° F; and

WHEREAS, such terminations are dangerous and injurious to the health of citizen consumers; and

WHEREAS, these terminations are especially hard upon older citizens on fixed incomes and seasonal workers who are unemployed during the winter; and


WHEREAS, the Citizen/Labor Energy Coalition, a national organization, has proclaimed November 21, 1978, as National No-Winter-Power-Shut-Off Day; and

WHEREAS, the Central Illinois Consumer Energy Council, a local coalition of groups working to protect consumer interests in the power area, has joined the national organization in calling for observance of No-Winter-Power-Shut-Off Day.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

That the Urbana City Council goes on record as supporting November 21, 1978 as No-Winter-Power-Shut-Off Day and furthermore encourages the Illinois State Legislature to develop such legislation as will support the spirit of the observance of this day
