

RESOLUTION NO. 8384-R29

A RESOLUTION OF PROTEST

WHEREAS, Dr. K. L. Wronke and Paul Tatman have filed their amended petition for a Special Use Permit to establish a heliport for a helicopter ambulance service on the parcel described in the Champaign County Zoning Board of Appeals case file, and

WHEREAS, the said proposal is being considered by the various governmental authorities concerned under the style and name of CCZBA Case No. 491-S-83, and

WHEREAS, after due notice and public hearing on the said question, the Urbana Plan Commission forwarded its recommendation to the Urbana City Council that the Urbana City Council protest the proposed Special Use Permit contained in CCZBA Case No. 491-S-83, and

WHEREAS, the Urbana City Council, having duly considered all matters pertaining to said proposal, finds and determines that the proposed Special Use Permit would not be ~~in the~~ best interests of the City of Urbana and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

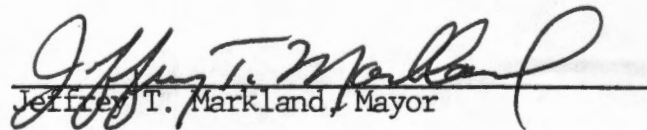
1. This City Council finds and determines that the facts contained in the above recitations are true.
2. That the Urbana City Council, on behalf of the said City, hereby resolves that the City of Urbana should and hereby does protest the proposed Special Use Permit as set forth in CCZBA Case No. 491-S-83, and urges that the Special Use Permit not be granted.

The City Clerk of the City of Urbana is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution of Protest with the County Clerk of the County of Champaign, and to mail a certified copy of this Resolution to the petitioners, Dr. K. L. Wronke, 903 South Main Street, Homer, Illinois 61849 and Paul Tatman, 805 Perkins Road, Urbana, Illinois 61801. It appearing that neither petitioner was represented by an attorney in this matter, no further certified copies need be sent.
